

KJAA Meeting  
Preview Show  
June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024

The meeting of the Kansas Junior Angus Association was called to order by President Jayce Dickerson on June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024. A roll call sheet was passed around for members to sign in on. There were 43 members present. New members and first-time juniors showing at the Preview show were asked to introduce themselves. These members were Drew McCurry, Bristol Jensen, and McKensie Fishburn. A motion was made by Creed Caldwell to approve last meetings minutes; Hannah Perrier seconded. The motion passed.

In officer reports, Lyle Perrier gave the Treasurer's report. The balance on 5/30/24 was \$49,404.58. Our total expenses were \$8,557.00 and our total income was \$14,228.00. Austin Woodrow reported he was working on the booth and the possible theme for the booth is old western. He is open to any ideas so reach out to him if you have any. Make sure to be practicing herdsmanship during nationals as there are judges walking around, also be sure to help each other out. Membership directors, Cheyenne Bruncker and Molly Hill, reported that they set up a play area and snacks for the kids during the show. For District Directors, Cohen Navinsky reported that there were 400 lbs. of ground beef donated to pantries. The KJAA donated \$400 to the Hutchinson Food Bank. Make sure to take your pop tabs to NJAS for the Angus Impact project. In the advisors' report, Clinton Laflin gave a few updates on NJAS. Everyone will be receiving the number of stalls that they entered as there is plenty of room in Wisconsin. There is a stalling sign-up sheet to put down who you want to be stalled by. There will be no individual stall dividers or signs, but we do need some end panels for the ends of the alleys. Brenna Wulfkuhle reported she was working on meals for nationals. The Kansas Angus Auxiliary has donated \$1000 for meals as you cannot bring food into the barns. Make sure to pack bug spray as there is mosquitos. Marya Haverkamp reported that the tailgate had been moved to Thursday night and it would be better to do a prepackaged snack and they were thinking about little waters. Anne Lampe reminded everyone that the blue bins are only for manure and not trash as we get fined for the trash in them. She will be needed everyone's t-shirt sizes for those not entered in Junior Nationals. T-shirts will only be ordered for juniors, advisors, and sponsors. The KJAA guidelines are outdated, so those will be updated and put on the webpage. Make sure to be working on quiz bowl, career development, and beef science posters and any other contest you entered. Be sure to review the schedule for nationals as they have changed it. Show days now start at 7:30. Brenna also reminded everyone to tell her if they wished to be on a quiz bowl team in Madison.

There was no old business.

Under new business, Lyle Perrier moved to budget \$100 for an item to donate to the Angus Foundation Auction. Cohen Navinsky seconded, and the motion passed. Cheyenne Bruncker moved to spend a maximum of \$800 on stall cards. Cohen seconded and the motion passed. Creed Caldwell moved to pay for the t-shirts of contest participants and exhibitors at the National Junior Angus Show. Cooper Woodrow seconded, and the motion passed. Hannah

Perrier moved to have a budget of \$1000 for the tailgate snacks and Henry Perrier seconded. Motion passed. The budget for meals for Kansas families throughout the week was discussed. Creed moved to have a budget of \$3000 and Henry seconded. The motion passed. It was discussed whether to purchase a camper spot to have our meals since food was allowed in the barns. Cooper Woodrow moved to purchase a camper spot at \$45 per night. Lyle Perrier seconded, and the motion passed. Aubree McCurry moved to sponsor a division award at the National Junior Angus Show. Eli Atkisson seconded, and the motion passed. Kaelyn Schilling moved to donate school supplies to the John Penny Learning Academy in Northeast Kansas for at risk kids. Cheyenne Bruner seconded, and the motion passed. Cheyenne Bruner moved to give the odd numbered district directs \$100. Dakota seconded and the motion passed.

Moving on to officer elections.
